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Keys Aspects of Ramadhan

For Fasting;

- Stay away from all types of sins regardless of them being small or big, as these will either make a fast Makrooh or even make it void.
- Ensure all fasts are kept to the best of one's ability, this will ensure the most reward.
- Increase in all kinds of worship including all prayers are prayed on time, making Dua at a time where Dua's are regularly accepted and increase in one's tilawat of the Holy Qur'an.

For Taraweeh;

- Praying taraweeh increases in reward and expiates sin as the prophet (Peace be upon Him) states in a saying: "Whoever stands in prayer during Ramadhan due to faith and seeking reward, his previous sins will be forgiven." Sahih al Bukhari and Sahih Muslim
- Praying in congregation is better than praying individually as the reward of it in increased as The Prophet lead the companions on several nights.

For Eid-ul-Fitr;

- Making sure that ghusl is made before Eid Salaah and wearing the best clothes one has, eating dates before going out to Eid Salaah as it is a Sunnah of The Prophet (Peace be upon Him), going to the masjid in using one route and coming back via another.
- As stated in Surah al Baqarah 2:185 saying Takbeer on the day of Eid, this should be done from one's house to the masjid and back. Ensuring that Zakaat al-Fitr is given before Eid Salaah.
- Offering congratulations to each other and exchanging gifts, this was a custom of The Prophet (Peace be upon Him) and the companions.
